Where Shall I Stay?



りょかん 旅館

A Ryokan is a traditional Japanese inn. They typically have tatami floor mats and you sleep on a futon and have an onsen. You can wear a yukata around the ryokan.



みんしゆく 民宿

A Minshyuku is a budget form of a ryokan, and is similar to a Bed and Breakfast. Compared to a ryokan, the minshyuku is more communal.



ホテル

A Japanese hotel is not much different from that of any other country. However, you can get a Japanese style room (わしつ和室), or a western style room (ようしつ洋室).
